Alaska Native Claims Selection

The purpose of this decision is to modify the Decision to Issue Conveyance (DIC) dated December 30, 1982, and the notice of DIC published in the FEDERAL REGISTER on January 4, 1983, pages 344 and 345. The DIC reserved certain easements as recommended in the Alaska State Director (SD), Bureau of Land Management (BLM), memorandum dated January 27, 1982, for the village of Noatak.

On July 1, 1983, the SD memorandum of January 27, 1982 was amended as to easements numbered E1N 11 C5, D1, D9, E1N 16 C1, and E1N 21 C1.

Therefore, the DIC dated December 30, 1982, is modified as follows:

Easement (E1N 11 C5, D1, D9) now reads:

- b. (E1N 11 C5, D1, D9) An easement for an existing access trail, twenty-five (25) feet in width, beginning in Sec. 9, T. 25 N., R. 19 W., Kateel River Meridian, southeasterly to public lands. The uses allowed are those listed above for a twenty-five (25) foot wide trail easement. The season of use will be limited to winter.

This easement is hereby modified to read:

- b. (E1N 11 C5, D1, D9) An easement twenty-five (25) feet in width for a partially proposed, partially existing access trail beginning at trail E1N 13 C5 on the right bank of the Noatak River in Sec. 9, T. 25 N., R. 19 W., Kateel River Meridian, southeasterly to public lands. The uses allowed are those listed for a twenty-five (25) foot wide easement. The season of use will be limited to winter.

Easement (E1N 16 C1) now reads:

- d. (E1N 16 C1) A one (1) acre site easement, upland of the ordinary high water mark, on the right bank of the Noatak River, in Sec. 1, T. 26 N., R. 19 W., Kateel River Meridian. The uses allowed are those listed above for a one (1) acre site.

This easement is hereby modified to read:

- d. (E1N 16 C1) A one (1) acre site easement upland of the ordinary high water mark on the left bank of the Noatak River in Sec. 36, T. 27 N., R. 19 W., Kateel River Meridian. The uses allowed are those listed for a one (1) acre site.

Easement (E1N 21 C1) now reads:

- e. (E1N 21 C1) A one (1) acre site easement, upland of the ordinary high water mark, on the left bank of the Noatak River in Secs. 34 and 35, T. 23 N., R. 20 W., Kateel River Meridian. The uses allowed are those listed above for a one (1) acre site.

This easement is hereby modified to read:

- e. (E1N 21 C1) A one (1) acre site easement upland of the ordinary high water mark on the right bank of the Noatak River in Secs. 27 and 34, T. 24 N., R. 20 W., Kateel River Meridian. The uses allowed are those listed above for a one (1) acre site.

In accordance with Departmental regulation 43 CFR 2650.7(d), notice of this modified decision is being published once in the FEDERAL REGISTER and once a week for four (4) consecutive weeks, in the TUNDRA TIMES.

Any party claiming a property interest in lands affected by this modified decision, an agency of the Federal government, or regional corporation may appeal the modified decision to the Interior Board of Land Appeals, Office of Hearings and Appeals, in accordance with the attached regulations in Title 43 CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS (CFR), Part 4, Subpart E, as revised. However, pursuant to Public Law 96-487, this modified decision constitutes the final administrative determination of the Bureau of Land Management concerning navigability of water bodies.

If an appeal is taken, the notice of appeal must be filed in the Bureau of Land Management, Alaska State Office, Division of Conveyance Management (960), 701 C Street, Box 13, Anchorage, Alaska 99513. Do not send the appeal directly to the Interior Board of Land Appeals. The appeal and copies of pertinent case files will be sent to the Board from this office. A copy of the appeal must be served upon the Regional Solicitor, 701 C Street, Box 34, Anchorage, Alaska 99513.

The time limits for filing an appeal are:

1. Parties receiving service of this modified decision by personal service or certified mail, return receipt requested, shall have thirty (30) days from receipt of this modified decision to file an appeal.
2. Unknown parties, parties unable to be located after reasonable efforts have been expended to locate, parties who failed or refused to sign their return receipt, and parties who received a copy of this modified decision by regular mail which is not certified, return receipt requested, shall have until February 21, 1984, to file an appeal.

Any party known or unknown who is adversely affected by this modified decision shall be deemed to have waived those rights which were adversely affected unless an appeal is timely filed with the Bureau of Land Management, Alaska State Office, Division of Conveyance Management.

To avoid summary dismissal of the appeal, there must be strict compliance with the regulations governing such appeal. Further information on the manner of and requirements for filing an appeal may be obtained from the Bureau of Land Management, 701 C Street, Box 13, Anchorage, Alaska 99513.
