meet certain requirements to provide resistance to pipe floatation and not be subject to hydraulic or thermal erosion, and not damage the pipe coating system. Excavated soils that meet these requirements will be used for backfill. Otherwise, imported granular material will be placed around the pipe to a depth of 12 inches from the top of the pipe and excavated soil will be mound over the granular material.

Construction camp for TAG pipeline will generally be located at former TAIPS construction campsites and also be located at the site of each compressor station. A liquid natural gas (LNG) plant and marine terminal are proposed at Anderson Bay. Two LNG tanker berths are proposed for mooring and loading of LNG tankers.

Minimal damage or harm to vegetation will occur in the right-of-way area and would be limited to the immediate vicinity of the pipeline and construction/maintenance road. All areas disturbed by construction, maintenance, operation and termination will be reclaimed.

Proposed commencement for construction of the gas pipeline is 1990, with an estimated construction time of five years. Approximate number of persons to be employed at peak of construction is 10,000, averaging 8,355. The approximate number of persons to be employed to operate and maintain the pipeline would be 500.

Public hearings on the right-of-way lease application will be set at a future date. The State Department of Natural Resources will furnish all copies of the application to persons requesting them.
