1. Pursuant to 24 CFR, Subsection 905.204 Indian Preference in contracting, the Northwest Inupiat Housing Authority is conducting a bid limited to Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises. The Northwest Inupiat Housing Authority will receive from Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises only, sealed bids, in duplicate, for the construction of projects listed hereafter until 4:00 p.m. local time, on the ninth day of May, 1986 at the office of the Northwest Inupiat Housing Authority at Kotzebue Alaska at which time all bids will be publicly opened and read aloud. If the Northwest Inupiat Housing Authority fails to receive an approvable bid or proposal from one or more qualified Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises, the Northwest Inupiat

Housing Authority will advertise for bids or proposals without limiting the bidding to Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises.

2. A prospective contractor seeking to qualify as an Indian Organization or Indian-Owned Economic Enterprise shall submit with or prior to submission of his bid:

(a) Evidence of structure, management and financing affecting the Indian character of the enterprise, including major subcontract and purchase agreements, material or equipment supply arrangements; and management salary or profit-sharing arrangements; and evidence showing the effect of these on the extent of Indian ownership and interest.

(b) Evidence showing fully the extent of Indian ownership and interest.

(c) Evidence sufficient to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the IHA and HUD that the prospective contractor has the technical, administrative and financial capability to perform contract work of the size and type involved and within the time provided under the proposed contract.

3. INDIAN PREFERENCE

(a) The work to be performed under this Contract is on a project subject to Section 7(b) of the Indian Self Determination and Education Assistance Act (25 U.S.C. 450e (b)). Section 7(b) requires that to the greatest extent feasible (1) preference and opportunities for training and employment shall be given to Indians, and (2) preferences in the award of contracts and sub-contracts shall be given to Indian organizations and Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises.

(b) The parties of this Contract shall comply with the provisions of said Section 7(b) and all HUD requirements pursuant thereto.

(c) The Contractor shall, in connection with this contract, to the greatest extent feasible, give preference in the award of any subcontracts to Indian organization and Indian-Owned Economic Enterprises, and preferences and opportunities for training and employment of Indians.

(d) The Contractor shall include this Section 7(b) clause in every subcontract in the connection with the Project and shall, at the direction of the IHA, take appropriate action pursuant to the subcontract upon a finding by the IHA or HUD that the subcontractor is in violation of the Section 7(b) clause
