Buffy will be arriving in Anchorage on October 25, along with her agent Bert Block from Connecticut, from Lihue, Kauai on the Hawaiian Islands.

A large number of Alaska's dignitaries, Native leaders and scores of ordinary folks are expected to attend the Tundra Times annual, record-breaking social event where 1,100 people

Besides Buffy, Alaska Governor William A. Egan is expected to speak along with Washington State Congressman Lloyd Meeds, Bureau of Indian Affairs Commissioner Morris Thompson, Senators Mike Gravel and Ted Stevens and Congressman Don Young, and others.

The price of admission is straight across the line at \$15 per person. There will be a cocktail hour from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at which time the banquet will begin. The dress for the occasion will be semi-formal.

Attending the banquet will be people from Seattle, Washington, Washington, D. C. and New York. A large number of people from Fairbanks will be coming to the feast and from all corners of Alaska.

Since the banquet is being held some two weeks before the general election on November 5, 1974, prominent politicians and their friends are expected to participate.

The banquet is being held in conjunction with the Alaska Federation of Natives, Inc.
