

OPERATIONAL STRIP AT GALENA

Bush pilots and Air Force flyers have an operational runway again at Galena Airport.

Rehabilitation of that State facility, which is used by the public as well as Alaskan Air Command, has been the job of S. S. Mullen Construction &

Associates under a Corps of Engineers competitive contract.

The Air Force, whose funds paid for the repairs, accepted the runway for use on September 25, pending final contract settlement.

\$80,000 FOR VILLAGE POLICE TRAINING

JUNEAU — Governor William A. Egan announced today that an \$80,000 grant for village police training has been approved by the Governor's Commission on the Administration of Justice.

Egan said he has been assured that federal concurrence for the

grant will be forthcoming.

The funds will enable the state to train 60 village officers at weeklong schools to be held in Bethel and Nome, and a 30-day advanced training school at the Public Safety Academy in

Sitka.

This will be the fourth year of village police training in Alaska. Egan recently announced authorization of 20 village constable positions that will be funded by the state.
