

Gravel After Wildwood Funding

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Senator Mike Gravel (Democrat — Alaska) has embarked on what he calls "an all-out effort" to secure U. S. Department of Agriculture funding for the Wildwood "controlled-environment" agriculture experiment in rapid food production.

The Senator recently arranged a meeting between himself, the Chairman of the Senate Agriculture Committee, Herman Talmadge (D. — Ga.), USDA officers of the Research Service, and Alex Shadura of the Kenai Native Association, Inc.

Following that meeting, Senator Gravel said that Senator Talmadge "is quite interested in the project." Senator Gravel indicated that he will also be in touch with Senator Gale McGee (D. — Wyo.), ranking Democrat on the Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture.

Senator Gravel said he will push for a "line item appropriation" of \$1.6 million, to be earmarked solely for the Kenai Native Association project at the old Wildwood Air Force base. Initial funding from the Federal Office of Economic opportunity, used to get the project underway runs out on June 30, the end of the current fiscal year.

Crucial to the crop experiment were several large electrical generators that the Air Force had at the facility. Senator Gravel persuaded the Air Force to leave the generators behind as a donation to the experiment and the people of Kenai.

Final transfer of the entire facility to the Native Association was officially completed several months ago.

"I visited the facilities on April 16," the senator said, "and I was immediately impressed by the potential of the project. It can revolutionize food production and consumption in even the most remote villages in Alaska. It could mean fresh vegetables and fruits year round, and at lowered cost."

The Alaska Democrat commended the Native Association for its "example of leadership, ingenuity, and willingness to work hard for the benefit of its own people."

Both Senator Gravel and Alex Shadura, project director for the Native Association, have stressed

the job opportunities that will follow from the project. Almost 200 people eventually may be hired from the Kenai Peninsula, if the funds are appropriated.

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Commerce, under authority vested by AS 45.55.240, proposes to amend regulations in title 3 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement AS 45.55.040(f) and AS 45.55.140(a)(11), as follows:

(a) 3 AAC 08.020 is amended by adding a new provision which registered agents, as well as registered broker-dealers and investment advisers, to post a surety bond, in the amount of \$5,000, with the administrator. The conforms with AS 45.55.040(f) which currently provides all registered broker-dealers, investment advisers, and agents shall file the bond.

(2) 3 AAC 08.310(1) is amended as follows:

Not-for-profit issuers shall file a notice with the Administrator at least 30 days prior to the making of any offers or sales of securities; the notice shall contain a ruling or determination by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service in recognition of the issuers exempt status under section 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or such other documentation as the Administrator may require including, but not limited to, certified financial statements; by-laws and Articles of Incorporation; plan of financing; plan of operation; use of proceeds; background of officers and directors (or principal officers and directors).
