Once you have your entry sheet and the amount of tags you need for each exhibit, bring it or have someone take it to the fairgrounds on "early entry day" Tuesday, August 13th, between the hours of 9:00 a. m. to 8:00 p. m.

If you can't come in personally, you may mail your exhibits to the fairgrounds at the above address anytime starting August 1st. Make sure you include enough postage money and your address, so that the fair office can mail your exhibit back to you after the five day fair.
