"Libertarianism is a political philosophy of individual liberty. A person has a right to live his life as he chooses and without coercion as long as he leaves others to do the same," said Paul Beaird, the Libertarian candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives.

Beaird compares the government to a big business and its "national resourses" are private citizens. He does not believe in government intervention in the social and economic aspects of society. He calls it coercion.

"Natives are victimized," he said. "The government is deciding to impose a culture on a peo-ple whether they want it or

"The taxpayers are victimized by supporting the Natives," he added

"All education ought to be privately financed so people can be trained to the full abilities of their talents. Now there is a definite bias in education in favor of the college prep against those who want to pursue other areas," said Beaird.

A person should be able to purchase the education he wants,

Beaird said.

"Government education is not successfully assimilating Native thinking to an industrial cul-ture," declared the Libertarian.

"The government is forcibly
