

Head Start Programs Financed

The Office of Economic Opportunity is prepared to finance summer head start programs in excess of regular county guideline allocations, it was announced.

Communities in Alaska wishing to apply for a summer program have a March 31 deadline for filing proposals with the regional office at 100 McAllister Street, San Francisco.

Guidelines for election districts in Alaska are as follows: Prince of Wales, \$878; Ketchikan, \$3,826; Wrangell-Petersburg, \$3,077; Sitka, \$2,270; Juneau, \$3,381; Lynn Canal-Icy Strait, \$1,966; Cordova-McCarthy, \$901; Valdez-Chitina, \$2,223;

Palmer-Wasilla, \$4,118; Anchorage, \$27,682; Seward, \$1,673; Kenai-Cook Inlet, \$5,464; Kodiak, \$3,182; Aleutian Island, \$2,153; Bristol Bay, \$3,054; Bethel, \$9,711; Kuskokwim, \$2,831; Yukon-Koyukuk, \$3,498; Fairbanks, \$14,169; Upper Yukon, \$1,825; Barrow, \$1,556; Kobuk, \$4,645; Nome, \$7,628; and Wade Hampton, \$5,288.

Any district whose guideline figure is less than \$3,000 may apply for up to \$3,000.
