

U.S. Government Subsidy to Wien Air Alaska Decreased

The President of Wien AIR ALASKA, Mr. Sigure Wien, reports the U.S. Government subsidy to the Airline decreased \$270,807 during the twelve months ended Jan. 31, 1966.

During this period there were 26,225 aircraft departures for a total of 3,053,443 revenue aircraft miles. It was also reported that the Airline flew on its schedules 1,891,842 passenger revenue ton miles, an increase of 14% compared to

last year.

Freight revenue ton miles totalled 1,322,687 for an increase of 10% and mail ton hours increased 23% for an all time high of 1,111,593.

Wien attributed the stimulating effect of new bush aircraft, new facilities, improved service and extended schedules of Wien AIR ALASKA as being the major factors in the development of this increased traffic.
