

Information On Native Foods To Be Presented at Workshop

A workshop for nutrition specialists with state and federal agencies will be held March 14 to 15 in the Captain Cook Hotel in Anchorage according to Agnes Sunnell, home economics leader with the Cooperative Extension Service, University of Alaska.

The workshop will feature leading nutritionists from every part of the field of nutrition education and research the home economist said.

Dr. Evelyn Spindler, nutritionist with the Federal Extension Service, Washington, D.C. will open the session with a talk on "What Influences People's Food Habits."

Dr. Christine Heller, nutritionist with the U.S. Public Health Service in Anchorage, will speak on "What We're Learning About Native Alaskan's Food at Arctic Health Research."

The Monday afternoon program will open with Dr. Elizabeth Tower, M.D., Alaska Health Department, Anchorage, discussing "The Medical Pro-

fession Looks at Human Nutrition and Health in Alaska."

She will be followed on the program by two nutritionists with the U.S. Public Health Service in Anchorage. Winston Osborn will offer "Some Observations on Human Nutrition and Health in Alaska." Marian Bryan will speak from the title, "The Practicing Nutritionist Looks at Human Nutrition."
