

Goodwin resigns from ESCA-Tech

Dr. Paul A. Goodwin, president of ESCA-Tech Corporation, a subsidiary of Calista Corporation, recently resigned from his position as President of the ESCA-Tech subsidiary. His resignation will be effective on Sept. 12 after which date Dr. Goodwin will be self-employed as the head of Variance Corporation.

Goodwin has served as president and chief executive officer of the Earth Science Consulting and Technology firm since November of 1977. On Dec. 1, 1978, he also assumed the dual position of vice president of operations for Calista Corporation. He served in this capacity for one year before he returned to the full time role of ESCA-Tech president.

Dr. Goodwin praised the members of the ESCA-Tech and Calista Board of Directors and remarked, "They are the finest board I ever had the privilege of working with and it is with regret that I resign my position within ESCA-Tech Corporation."

The new corporate owner has the distinction of being the most educated Native American in the nation. He has five degrees in

four different subject areas, including a ph.D in Ionospheric Physics from the Geophysical Institute, University of Alaska, in Fairbanks.

His paper on the infra-sound of the Aurora Borealis was presented at an Amsterdam conference in the Fall of 1976 and

established his as the prevailing theory of phenomenon which had puzzled scientists until then.

Dr. Goodwin also served as an adjunct professor at Alaska Pacific University where he taught a class in physics.
