

# Sheldon Jackson College Announces New Fall Courses

This fall Sheldon Jackson College will introduce an exciting new series of classes including a class in Travel Administration. In it students will explore the total world of travel and the travel industry. Tentative plans include visits to local agencies and airlines. On-the-job experience gained through this course will allow students to move directly into a career in the rapidly-expanding travel industry.

Another newly offered course will be a Wildlife Seminar. Students will become acquainted with wildlife species native to Southeast Alaska, and varied aspects of wildlife management. Guest speakers from the U.S. Forest Service, National Park Service and Department of Fish and

Game will participate in the seminar.

Introduction to Youth Ministries will explore the meaning of Christian witness in the contemporary world. This class will include Bible study, interpersonal relations, effective communication and the important dimensions of a personal faith.

The January Interim will include an Ethnic Music class which will examine the humanities through the eyes of Ethnic Art. Students will attend concerts, art exhibits, and theater productions. Noted San Franciscan composer Bob Hughes will illustrate relationships between Alaskan music and music from other parts of the world.

During the Interim a re-

ligious visitation trip is being planned. Students will travel along the west coast of the U.S. to conduct religious programs telling the story of the Christian mission in Alaska.
