

Centennial Poetry Volume Is Printed; Sponsors are Needed

The centennial Poetry Volume, covering 100 years of Alaska's verse, has gone to the printer. Publication date is set for World Poetry Day in October of 1966.

This is going to be a beautiful book, set in clear, legible type, with a laminated birch cover, and line drawings by Diana Tillion, said Herb Adams, executive director of

the Centennial Commission.

Expenses have risen and sponsors are being sought. The first 100 copies are going to be collector's items.
