Based upon this year's session, Representative Chuck Degnan, D-Unalakleet, says that the session next year need not last more than 45 days but because of political consider-ation of the urban areas it will be necessary to extend the session to 60 days to give the appearance of responsibility to the Anchorage area.

"The length of the session will be dictated by the McVeigh-

Fink Republicans as it was this year," charges Degnan.

The legislative session would have been completed within 60 days this year but the House leadership floundered. tion and job opportunities.
"These problems are addressed but on a microscopic scale, compared to the need which has been established over the years. Rural Alaskans are willing to help themselves but they should not be asked to go beyond their capabilities as private citizens."
