State Review of Federal Permits

Cominco Alaska has requested the
Office of Management and Budget,
Division of Governmental Coordi-
nation to review the Federal ap-
provals required for the Red Dog
Mine Project, for consistency with
the standards of the Alaska Coastal
Management Program, 6 AAC 80.
The Department of Environmental
Conservation has also been requested
to review Federal approvals for
State Certification of reasonable as-
surance of compliance with the
State's water quality standards, 18
AAC 70.

The Red Dog Mine Project is lo-
cated in the DeLong Mountains
of Northwest Alaska. Cominco Alas-
ka has proposed to develop an open-
pit mine with adjacent ore milling
facilities, a 56 mile road, and a port
facility on the Chukchi Sea.
