NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT REGULATIONS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Notice is given that the Division of Economic Development, Department of Commerce and Economic Development, under the authority of AS 44.33.020(1), proposes to adopt regulations in Title 3 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with identification seals and emblems for handicrafts produced in Alaska, to implement AS 45.65.101.070, as follows:

1.) The SILVER HAND seal is exclusively for the identification of Alaskan Native handicrafts; the MADE IN ALASKA emblem can be utilized to identify any product or handicraft, art object or other similar article may apply to use the SILVER HAND seal or the MADE IN ALASKA emblem, subject to meeting certain eligibility criteria requirements.

2.) The regulations establish: (a) eligibility criteria for persons to use the SILVER HAND seal on their handicrafts; (b) eligibility for products to display the MADE IN ALASKA emblem; (c) limitations and restrictions on the utilization of the seal or the emblem; (d)

eligibility criteria for persons wishing to be agents for either the SILVER HAND or MADE IN ALASKA programs; and (e) application fees for authorization to use the SILVER HAND seal and MADE IN ALASKA emblem and for persons wishing to be SILVER HAND or MADE IN ALASKA agents.

3.) Any authorization or permit to use the SILVER HAND seal, to act as a SILVER HAND agent, or to use the MADE IN ALASKA emblem made prior to the effective date of these regulations will become declared null and void. Persons holding such permits will have 60 days to reapply under the new regulations.

This action is not expected to require an increased appropriation.

Notice is also given that any person may present written statements or arguments relevant to the proposed action by writing to the Director, Division of Economic Development, Department of Commerce and Economic Development, 3601 C Street, Suite 724, Anchorage, AK 99503, so that they are received no later than May 12, 1993.

If you have an interest in the designated parcels, you should contact the village corporation to review the map of boundaries to be sure the map includes your claim.

1. Community Expansion Lands

Approximately 85 acres of land including a watershed area, two post 1971 homes, and land for future community expansion.

2. Access Road

A 60' wide corridor of land for a portion of a future access road from the Village of Chignik Lake easterly to tidewater. Containing 15.87 acres more or less.

3. Landfill

A proposed site not to exceed 10 acres to be determined within 10 years.

The total proposed transfer of ANCSA 14 (c)(3) lands, for the Native Village of Chignik Lake is 251.31 acres, more or less, 140.31 of which have already been conveyed. A complete legal description and map of the parcel is available for inspection at the Department of Community and Regional Affairs office in Anchorage.

Pursuant to AS 44.47150(a) and 19 AAC 90.015, the Municipal Land Trust Officer, acting on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, has decided to accept the offer, together with previous conveyances, in complete satisfaction of the obligation of Chignik River Ltd. under section 14(c)(3) of ANCSA. This decision was reached after consultation with

the village of Chignik Lake through the recognized appropriate village entity; upon weighing the best interests of those residents and any future city that might be established; and upon an application of the standards in 19 AAC 90.020.
