The poster is one of several made by ANMC patient Charles Pedro for the program and the special hospital contest to urge everyone to bring in old medicines for the pharmacist to dispose of safely. Dr. Brown points out that accidental swallowing of things poisonous when eaten causes more deaths in children over one year of age than the next seven causes combined. She urges patients to keep medicines and household cleaners locked away from curious children.
