The X-CED Program is a fieldbased, distant-learning, teacher education program leading to the Bachelor of Education (B.ED.) degree. Approximately 130 students, mostly Alaska Natives, are served throughout rural Alaska by faculty members and Regional Coordinators from the field centers named above. Regional Coordinators are supervised by the field faculty members assigned to the same service region. They work closely with X-CED students in the region, assisting them with coursework and providing other support services. They are also responsible for assisting with the development of the X-CED Program within the region, working with local groups and organizations. They also work closely with regional schools and school districts.
