This leaflet, publication No. 30, contains recommendations for 1973-74. A copy of this should be a real help to the inexperienced gardener or an old hand wanting to try a new plant outdoors.

Plant as early as moisture and soil temperature conditions If soil is worked while permit. too wet it may become hard and compact when it dries. If the is too cold the seeds may rot before germinating.
On the other hand if one de-

lays too long the soil may get too dry or the season be too

short for plants to mature.
Use recommended (see publication No. 30) or know varieties. With some types or known plants this is very critical with others the recommendations are made primarily on yield variations and may be of lesser im-

portance.
