

Interior Alaska Has Excellent Climate for Hardy Vegetables

Interior Alaska is blessed with an excellent climate for growing many hardy vegetable crops. A few crops considered to be warm weather plants and a number of flowers, especially if grown indoors early and transplanted to the garden, also do well.

The Cooperative Extension Service, University of Alaska, publishes a leaflet about every two years in cooperation with

the Institute of Agricultural Sciences on recommended vegetable varieties for Interior Alaska.

This leaflet, publication No. 30, contains recommendations for 1973-74. A copy of this should be a real help to the inexperienced gardener or an old hand wanting to try a new plant outdoors.

Several bits of advice might

be in order to the potential gardener.

Plant as early as moisture and soil temperature conditions permit. If soil is worked while too wet it may become hard and compact when it dries. If the soil is too cold the seeds may rot before germinating.

On the other hand if one delays too long the soil may get too dry or, the season be too

short for plants to mature.

Use recommended (see publication No. 30) or known varieties. With some types of plants this is very critical with others the recommendations are made primarily on yield variations and may be of lesser importance.

The Extension Service provides a list of sources for recommended seeds to known

garden stores and seed dealers each year. Anyone requesting this listing would be supplied with it.

Planting depth and row and seed or plant spacing recommendations appear on seed packets and in Extension bulletin 135, "Gardens in Alaska." Each plant has its own requirements.

Remember the deeper you go the colder the soil is. Don't plant on a chunk of ice. Even potatoes should be no more 2" or 3" deep.

Other things to remember are weeding, watering and thinning.

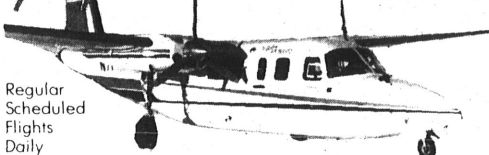
