

Alaska Steamship to Make Ten Voyages to Bering Sea

Ten voyages for the annual resupply of the Bering Sea region will be made by the Alaska Steamship Company this season, J. F. O'Sullivan, Bering Sea division manager of the line announced recently.

"This is the only commercial common carrier service to that area," O'Sullivan said.

Four sailings have been set for Bristol Bay, three for the Kuskokwim and three for the Nome area.

The Bristol Bay stops will be: Coastal Rambler, Talkeetna, Nenana and another not designated as yet. The Tatalina and two other ships will handle the Kuskokwim area.

The Alaska Steamship Company also provides weekly service the year around to Southeastern Alaska, two sailings each week to the Alaska Railbelt and a sailing every other week to Kodiak and Adak.
