

Barlett's Potlatch Set for April 24

Senator Bob Bartlett will be in Fairbanks April 24 to participate in Bartlett's Potlatch, a special celebration by Alaska 67 in honor of his birthday and 26 years in Congress, according to Curt Boone, President of Alaska 67.

The official Alaska 67 emblem will be presented in a spectacular fireworks display at Growden Memorial Park. James Welkel, one of the country's foremost pyrotechnists, will supervise and produce a show expected to be unequalled in the Northland.

In addition to the display, special entertainment will be provided by the Men's and Women's Drill Teams from the University of Alaska; Lathrop High School Band; Sweet Adelines, a women's barbershop group; the University Choir; the Vern Brock Dancers; the Ninth Army Band and many others, according to Geneva Emmal, Alaska 67 Vice-President in charge of Performing Arts.

"The potlatch is free to Alaska 67 members, and it is just one of the many special events that Alaska 67 will be presenting in the next three years," Boone said. All children will be admitted free.

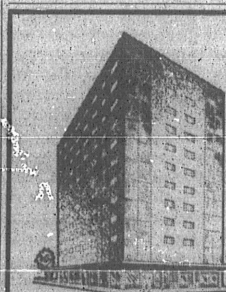
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What Saith The Scriptures
