discharged into Chester Creek from a manhole excavation on a sewer line construction project.

Environmental Conservation Commissioner Max Brewer said his department's Anchorage staff investigated the pollution in-cident and ordered that the discharge be stopped immediate-

Brewer said the Department

moved rapidly to correct the siltation problem "because a moved rapidly to correct the siltation problem "because a heavy silt load has great potential to do significant damage to the improving ecosystem of Chester Creek."

Any environmental damage to Chester Creek "must be prevented so that its value as a source of recreation for Anchorage area residents will continue,"
