Notice is hereby given that the Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education under authority vested by AS 14.40.935 proposes to adopt regulations in Title 20 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement AS 14.40 as 7 follows:

20 AAC is amended by adding a new chapter relating to the Alaska State Educational incentive Grant Program to provide as follows:

- Grant purpose. Through the incentive grant program, eligible undergraduate students may receive grants from \$100 to \$1,500 for attendance at an accredited post-secondary education institu-
- Student eligibility. Under-graduates who are at least two-year Alaskan residents may apply at their insti-tution of attendance. Fur-ther eligibility requirements are described.
- Application procedures, pri-orities, and appeals. App-lication procedures are de-tailed through regulation.
- Disbursement procedures. Regulations describe procedures for distributing grant awards to students.
- Definitions. Definitions include: "commission", "substantial financial need", and "undergraduate".
