NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF ALASKA COMMISSION ON POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION

Notice is hereby given that the Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education under authority vested by AS 14.40.935 proposes to adopt regulations in Title 20 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement AS 14.40 as follows:

20 AAC is amended by adding a new chapter relating to the Alaska State Educational Incentive Grant Program to provide as follows:

1. Grant purpose. Through the incentive grant program, eligible undergraduate students may receive grants from \$100 to \$1,500 for attendance at an accredited postsecondary education institution.
2. Student eligibility. Undergraduates who are at least two-year Alaska residents may apply at their institution of attendance. Further eligibility requirements are described.
3. Application procedures, priorities, and appeals. Application procedures are detailed through regulation.
4. Disbursement procedures. Regulations describe procedures for distributing grant awards to students.
5. Definitions. Definitions include two-year "resident", "substantial financial need", and "undergraduate".

Copies of the proposed regulations may be obtained from the Executive Director of the Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education, Pouch F, Juneau, Alaska 99811.

Notice is also given that any person interested may present written comments or arguments relevant to the action proposed to the Executive Director of the Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education, Pouch F, Juneau, Alaska 99811.

The Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education upon its own motion or at the instance of interested parties, may at its first meeting after June 18, 1979, adopt the above proposals substantially as set forth without further notice, or may decide to take no action on them.
