These positions are full-time partially exempt positions located in Juneau. The annual salary ranges from \$27,500 to \$31,700 depending upon experience.

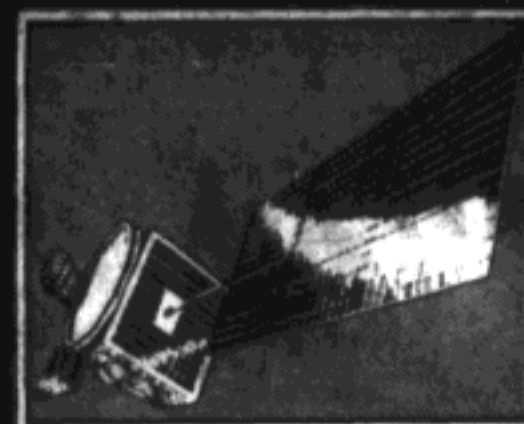

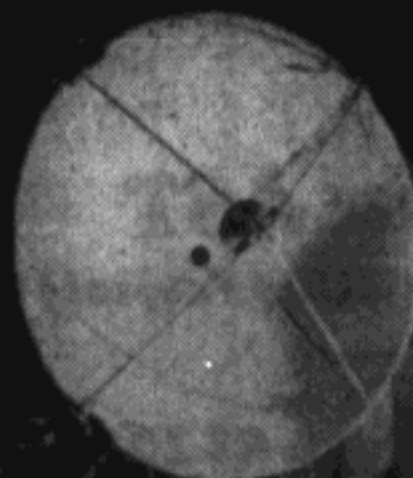
