On extension of the Commission, Hathaway said he wasn't familiar with it, but promised to "look into it and its federal role" if confirmed.

Hathaway also took a neutral position on questions regarding easements across federal lands in advance of conveyance of land to Alaskan Natives under terms of the settlement act, but said he would look into this "as quickly as possible and, as soon as I have an understanding of the issues involved, I will try to bring the matter to a resolution."

On the subject of designation of transportation and utility corridors across Alaska, Hathaway said "a question of this magnitude cannot be resolved without adequate input from the state and the Natives themselves."

Gravel said although Hathaway obviously didn't want to get locked into a position on a number of issues until he has had an opportunity to study them, "his support for studying the social and economic impact as part of an overall environmental study augers well for future development in Alaska, including leasing of the Outer Continental Shelf and gas pipeline construction."

The Alaska lawmaker asked Hathaway's position on revenue sharing, providing for distribution of 37-1/2 per cent of revenues from OCS development to the adjacent state, as well as full involvement of the state and its planning agencies in the planning and decision making processes.

The nominee said the federal government "needs to take a hard look at such proposals as revenue sharing, impact assistance, and involving the states in decisions" affecting them.

Hathaway said he realized "the high priority that the potential resources of the OCS can play in the country's drive toward energy self-sufficiency" and said he preferred not to take a position on the overall issue until he could be "thoroughly briefed."

Gravel said that although Hathaway's responses "are not as full and complete as we had hoped they might be, his commitment to state involvement in the decision-making process will help to assure Alaskans a voice when these issues are determined."

On other issues, Hathaway said he is "in general sympathy with the policy of Indian self-determination," feels that exploration and development of Naval Petroleum Reserves have been given the "highest priority" by the President and, that the question of whether it is managed by the Navy or Interior is of "secondary importance."

Hathaway said he will affirm his early attention to the environmental stipulations for construction of the trans Alaska oil pipeline, now underway, and the "commitment that they will be honored."

He was responding to concerns raised that, due to pressure to get the pipeline built, some of the stipulations are not being followed.
