

Randy Williams Gets Scholarship

HANOVER, N.H. — Randy Williams, a Dartmouth College junior from Fremont, Calif., has been named the first recipient of a Class of 1911 Samson Occom Scholarship, it was announced today by Harland W. Hoisington, Jr., director of financial aid for the College.

The scholarship was recently established by the Class of 1911 at Dartmouth, one of the college's oldest surviving classes, to emphasize the place the Samson Occom, a Mohegan Indian and pupil of the Rev. Eleazar Wheelock, the college's founder, has in the Dartmouth tradition.

Occom, also a minister, was instrumental in raising funds, largely in England, that aided in the founding of the College.

Mr. Williams, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Williams, 3656 Yorktown Road, Fremont, transferred to Dartmouth in the fall of 1974 from Ohlone College in Fremont. He is a member of the Nisqually tribe.
