The proposed amendment requires each school district's curriculum to contain a kindergarten through twelfth grade Alaska Studies scope and sequence which includes, at a minimum, the learning objectives in the Department of Education Alaska Studies Scope and Sequence, February 1990 edition.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Notice is given that the State Board of Education, under the authority of AS 14.07.060, AS 14.11.100, and AS 14.11.132, proposes to amend regulations in Title 4 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with school debt retirement accrued interest, to interpret AS 14.11.100, as follows:

Presently the State of Alaska reimburses municipalities for bonds issued to finance school construction projects approved under the provisions of AS 14.11.100. Current regulations allow the State to reimburse municipalities for interest payments, called accrued interest, that the purchaser pays the municipality at the time of purchase. The accrued interest is interest earned by the bond between the date of issuance and the date of purchase. Under this practice, municipalities return the accrued interest payment to the purchaser. The State, in turn, makes payment to the municipality for the accrued interest payment for which, in fact, the municipality incurred no out-of-pocket expenses. 4 AAC 31.061 (d)(3) is proposed for adoption to preclude reimbursement by the State of these accrued interest payments to municipalities.

4 AAC 31.060 (1) is proposed for adoption to define the term "accrued interest" as interest earned during the period between the date of issue of a bond and date of delivery of the bond to the purchaser.
