AIPRC releases film for distribution

"Act Now," a film on the American Indian Policy Review Commission, has just been completed and is ready for free distribution to all interested Indian tribes, organizations and individuals.

The twelve-minute color film, which provides a brief review of the history of federal Indian policy and explains the workings of the AIPRC, is designed to introduce the Commission's role to Indians throughout the United States. The theme of the film-which was produced by Michel/Heinz, a New York consulting firm-is the necessity for Native Peoples to work with the Commission in producing accurate and representative recommendations for a more rational and consistent government policy toward

American Indians.

Pamphlets, posters and information packets on the AIPRC are also available free of charge. In some cases, the Commission will be able to provide a speaker to present these materials along with the film and answer specific questions on the Commission's work.
