Principal items of work consist of the following: 80,000 tons of borrow; 3,100 tons of crushed aggregate base; 1,125 tons of hot asphalt pavement; 525 linear feet of cast in place concrete curb and gutter; 950 square yards of membrane water proofing; approximately 160 cubic yards of class A concrete, lump sum, all required; 57 prestressed concrete box girders; 1,540 linear feet of structural steel piles; 300 linear feet of metal bridge railing, approximately 34,000 pounds of reinforcing steel, lump sum, all required; Highway lighting system complete, lump sum, all required; and miscellaneous items of work.

All work shall be completed in 215 Calendar days.
