

Alaska Plants

FAIRBANKS — The University of Alaska Museum's collection of Alaskan plants is recognized as one of 105 national resource collections in a new National Science Foundation publication on botany resources in America.

The museum's extensive plant collection was among the top 59 in the analysis of 305 such collections.

Additionally, the museum's terrestrial vertebrates collection has been listed as one of 31 national repositories in the United States for such vertebrates by the American Society of Mammalogists' Advisory Committee for Systematic Resources in Mammalogy. To qualify for such a listing, the museum collection had to meet certain standards.
