

Young People Being Screened For Job Corps Training

The Alaska State Employment Service in implementing the nation-wide war on poverty, is now screening young people interested in entering the Job Corps.

The program provides basic education, skill, training, and useful work experience for persons between the ages of 16 and 21. It is aimed at those who need a change of environment and individual help to develop talents, self confidence, and motivation to improve themselves.

Job Corpsmen from Alaska are now living at Job Corps centers in the Pacific North-

west states, where they work, attend classes, and engage in recreational activities with people their own age. Upon graduation, Corpsmen are assisted in job seeking through Job Corps contacts with public and private employers and employment services.
