## Wildlife Service Considers Waiver Of Moratorium

Officials of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in Washington, D.C. are considering a waiver of the moratorium on the taking of Pacific Walrus and the implementation of regulations returning control of this species to the State of Alaska.

Under the Marine Mammal Protection Act of 1972, the taking of walrus and other marine mammals has been prohibited. An environmental assessment of thisction has been completed by the Fish and Wildlife Service and Director Lynn A. Greenwalt filed

On March 3 a prehearing conference will be held at the above address to determine if a public hearing on the action is necessary. If requested by the Administrative Judge, a hearing be held in Anchorage will sometime between March 19-21 time and place to be announced.
