

# Exhibition in Anchorage to feature works of artists who received visual arts fellowships

The recipients of the 1985 Visual Arts Fellowships from the Alaska State Council on the Arts will be featured in an invitational exhibition at the Anchorage Museum of History and Art Sunday through Oct. 12.

The participating artists will be honored at an opening reception from 1 to 3 p.m. Sunday. Each year, the council has awarded \$5,000 each to outstanding Alaska artists. This exhibition recognizes the artists who were selected in 1985 and presents their recent work, created within the year of the fellowship.

Anchorage area artists selected for the honor include Pat Austin, faculty member of Anchorage Community College; Robert Pfitzenmeier and David Felker, both former sculpture

studio managers of the Visual Arts Center of Alaska; and Jane Meyers of Girdwood, a mixed media artist who also is associated with the Visual Arts Center.

Artists from the Fairbanks area include Arthur William Brody, professor of art at the University of Alaska; Barry McWayne, curator of photography at the University of Alaska Museum; and Jo Going, an experimental artist who works in mixed media.

Southeast artists represented in the exhibition are Nathan Paul Jackson of Ketchikan, a traditional Tlingit artist who will exhibit his carved masks; and Juneau artist Bill C. Ray Jr., who will display his new large paintings.
