INVITATION FOR PROPOSALS

The Cook Inlet Housing Authority, as representative of five Regional Housing Authorities in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, will receive sealed proposals for a survey of housing conditions in 18 villages in Rural Alaska. The survey will consist of a recording of ownership, occupancy, and physical conditions of 346 houses, which were constructed under the Bartlett Act Housing Program of 1969 and 1970.

The proposal shall include a lump sum fee for performance of the survey, which shall include a record of (1) ownership of the property, (2) occupancy of the house, (3) list of repairs required to make the house habitable by local standards, (4) cost of these repairs and (5) a recommendation on whether it is feasible to rehabilitate the structure, or to provide new construction.
