His work background started as a laborer with the Alaska Railroad in 1945 and later as crane operator in 1957. He was employed with the post engineers at Fort Richardson. Since 1947 he has been a power plant operator to the present time.

George Ondola completed 9th grade at the Eklutna Vocational school at Eklutna and Seward.

He subsequently earned his high school diploma through the Anchorage Community College in 1962. He has also completed through a correspondent course on steam plant operation.

Ondola is well known for his concern for his people at Eklutna, especially on their land problems.

He likes reading and studying about various subjects of interest pertaining to the natives. He also likes to hunt, fish and camp.
