at the first meeting.

Margaret Boyd will do charcoal portraits; Shirley Di Giorgio will demonstrate children's toy making; Hannah Soloman will give demonstrations in bead.

Arlene Hunt, workshop coordinator, will demonstrate the preparation of canvas for oil painting, how to make three-dimensional wall plaques of bark and moss and how to make Christmas centerpieces and decorations.

Native arts and crafts have been sold at the Welcome Cen-

The Native Community Center will expand the store and future plans include a full time arts and crafts store for native made items.
