Huntington cops Willow crown

WILLOW - Carl Huntington survived a strong charge by Charlie Stevens to claim the Willow Championship in this past weekend's dog mushing activities.

Huntington posted the events fastest heat for the 2-day race on Saturday finishing with a time of 54:09 for 16 miles. Stevens finished second with a time of 55:03 and Bill Cotter finished third with a time of 56:34. Emmit Peters rounded out the top four positions with a 57:39 clocking. Four of the remaining

mushers finished under 60 minutes for the heat, and a total of 8 out of 9 finished under the hour mark.

In Sunday's finale only two mushers broke the hour mark as Charlie Stevens loped to a heat winning time of 56:24 and Carl Huntington finished at 57:02. 'Huntington's margin of victory on Saturday allowed him to hold off Stevens' bid for the championship. Huntington finished the race with a total elapsed time of 111.11, a scant 16 seconds faster than Stevens-who completed the 32 miles in 111:27. Weather played an important factor as, on the first day the temperature was near zero and on Sunday it warmed up to 20 above zero.

Emmit Peters rallied from a fourth place finish on Saturday to capture third place at 120:-03.

The next scheduled champ-

ionship competition will be this coming weekend, the Exxon Open.
