

Miss World Eskimo Olympics Rules Set Down by Pageant Committee

Mrs. Rhoda Forslund Fox, chairman of the Miss World Eskimo Olympics 1970 Committee, this week sent out application blanks, information sheets and a set of rules that must be followed by the Miss Olympics queen contestants. They were sent to about 37 villages, towns and cities.

Although some queen pageant applicants have already applied, including JoAnn Joseph of Stevens Village, Miss Fairbanks, many more applications are expected after the information sheets reach the localities.

QUALIFICATIONS

In order to qualify, contestants must fulfill the following qualifications:

- Entrants must be at least one quarter (1/4) Alaskan native.
- Entrants must be 16 through 21 years of age.
- Entrants must be single and must never have been married or had children.

JUDGING

-Entrants will be judged in native dress and foot gear and should have knowledge of their costumes.

-The contestants will also be judged in a personal interview with judges.

-The contestants will be judged on poise, personality and ability to converse with people and they should be familiar with

their respective areas for speaking purposes.

-Judging will be completed Saturday, August 1, 1970. The committee will work with the girls on grooming and poise.

GENERAL INFORMATION

-Entrants will be required to pay for their own transportation to and from Fairbanks, or their friends, organizations may defray their expenses.

-Housing and meals will be provided and paid for by the Eskimo Olympics Committee.

-Entrants should be provided with spending money by their villages.

—A black and white photograph of the contestant should be sent in advance of the contest for publicity purposes together with the completed application blank.

—Entrants will be met upon their arrival in Fairbanks (make sure the Committee is notified of your arrival time) and will be well chaperoned during their stay in Fairbanks.

—Fairbanks merchants are supplying many prizes for Miss Eskimo Olympics and activities are planned for the contestants.

RULES

The queen contest committee has drawn up stringent rules and emphasized that any violation of them will result in immediate disqualification.

—A contestant will not go downtown Fairbanks unless escorted by an Eskimo Olympics official.

—Permission of the chaperone will be necessary before a contestant may leave her group.

—There will be absolutely no alcoholic beverages.

—There will be no smoking in public.

—Proper dress of contestants will not include: levis, tennis shoes, etc.

—There will be no gum chewing in public appearances.
