Blind Eskimo Woman on Bahai Faith Mission

Mrs. Melba Call King of Seattle visited Nome, Kotzebue and Anchorage last week on a mission for the Bahai faith.

Mrs. King, originally from the abandoned village of Sovanoska in the Kuskokwim area, is an Eskimo adopted by Mrs. Corinne Call of Washington state. Though completely blind since childhood, Mrs. King worked her way through college, becoming the first blind graduate of Central Washington College, Ellensburg.

She belongs to the Seattle Local Spiritual Assembly of the Bahai and has worked as a secretary for the last 17 years. She also is corresponding secretary to the Alaska Native Sisterhood, Camp 36 in Seattle.
