Very often a single piece of correspondence could mean the difference between the rejection or acceptance of a land claim application. It is of vital importance that correspondence, legal documents, deadline notices, and requests for additional information reach the applicant.

Recently, a tremendous amount of correspondence addressed to Native allotment applicants, Native claims applicants, homesteaders, and trade and manufacturing sites is returned unclaimed.

Individuals with any type of land claim application pending that have a change of address, are urged to contact the Bureau of Land Management immediately.
