The United States Department of Labor at the request of Senator Stevens, has reminded all federal departments that their Alaskan construction projects costing \$10,000 or more must include equal employment opportunities goals as outlined in the "Alaskan Plan."

The "Alaskan Plan" provides guidelines for hiring of racial in construction projects.

The Alaska Republican has received complaints that certain federal offices were awarding contracts without complying with the "Alaska Plan to provide equal employment opportunity in the construction industry," which was supposed to go into effect July 5, 1972.

"The Alaskan Plan was negotiated over a several months period by a hard working committee of labor officials, contractors, and minority group representatives," said the senator.
