Huntington, elected in 1974 as an Independent write-in candidate, failed to enclose the required filing fee when he made notice of his intent to run, Thomas said. That disqualifies from appearing on the

Thomas said his office requested and received an opinion from the attorney general's office before telling

Huntington he was disqualified.
"The law's very clear on that point. I called and told him the best option now would be best option now would be another write-in campaign," Thomas said.

There were 179,876 Alaskans registered to vote as of June 1, the lieutenant governor said, a figure which he expects to surpass the 200,000 level before the November election because of interest in U.S. presidential elections. There were 170,065 persons registered to vote in 1974.
