

Denny Appointed Mgr. Of T-H Exec. Offices

The appointment of Mr. Theodore R. Denny to the position of manager of the executive offices of the central council of the Tlingit and Haida Indians of Alaska was announced by council president, John Borbridge.

The Central Council, with offices in Juneau, Alaska was created by an Act of Congress, and is the entity given congressional authority to plan for the disposition of \$7 million in judgement funds received as the result of a favorable decision in the Tlingit and Haida land suit in the Court of Claims.

Mr. Denny, a graduate of Averswalds Business College in Seattle, Washington, previously served the council as its president and has been active in Tlingit

and Haida affairs since 1958. He variously served Pacific Northern and then Western Airlines as senior accountant, maintenance cost accountant and staff accountant.

His familiarity with credit unions was evident from his successive elective positions as president of the PNA Federal Credit Union and as a member of the supervisory Committee of Westernair Federal Credit Union.

He recently concluded three months of intensive training in the field of development planning in the Washington, D.C. offices of the management consulting firm of Wolf and Company.

Mr. Denny, whose home community is Saxman, Alaska, will be joined by his wife Virginia and five sons.
