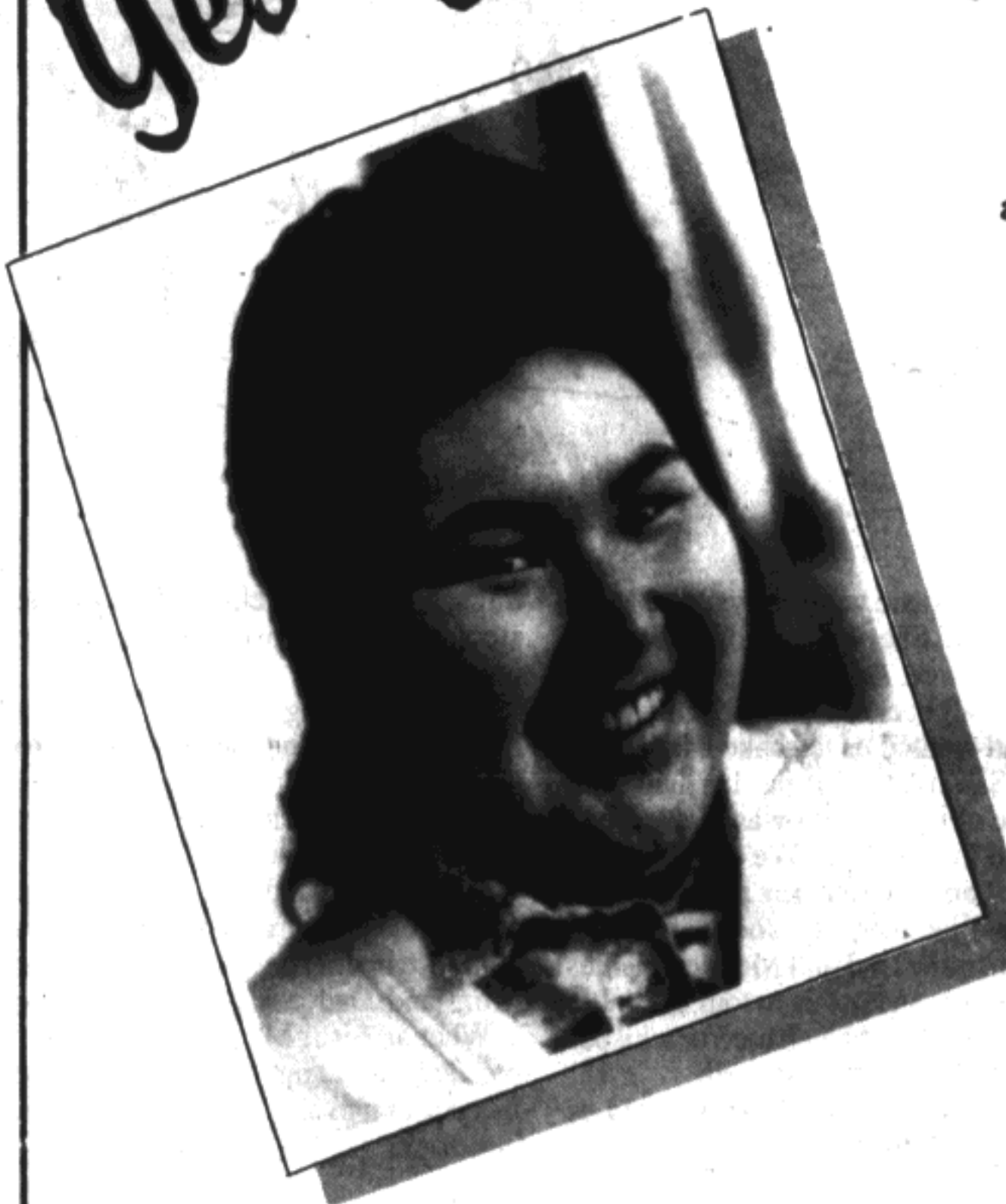


# Yes You Can!

## STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

As a college student, your primary RESPONSIBILITY IS TO MAKE SURE YOU HAVE ENOUGH MONEY TO PAY YOUR COLLEGE EDUCATION COSTS before you enroll for classes - transportation costs (includes airfare) is only one cost to think about!

Another responsibility is to apply for all other types of financial aid you are eligible to receive at your selected college/university.

Take and pass 12 credits per term and maintain a Grade Point Average of 2.0 at the end of each term.

Send final grade report at the end of each term - this provides a visual record of your academic efforts and your progress in your educational goal. Having the report on file is required before funding is continued for the following term.

Maintain your institution's Student Code of Conduct which you agree to follow by becoming a student there.

Notify the Coordinator if you change your address, the number of credits or if a difficult situation arises which you feel she may help you with.

## ELIGIBILITY

- A. Proof of Alaska Native blood quantum see village listing\*\*
- B. Be accepted into accredited institution;
- C. Be enrolled to a Bachelor's degree major area of study (within one year of starting college classes);
- D. Show a financial need AFTER all other sources of assistance are applied for and awarded.

## CUT OFF DATES

for SCHOLARSHIPS application:

APRIL 15th: for Fall classes;

OCTOBER 15th: for Spring classes;

FEBRUARY 28th: for Summer session

(junior/senior college rank only)

for OTHER REQUIRED PAPERS:

FALL — last week of July each year

SPRING — last week of November each year

## BASIC INFORMATION

1. Mail in completed AVCP Higher Education scholarship application before set cut off dates;
2. Write to your selected college or university and request:
  - a. Admission application;
  - b. Housing information and application;
  - c. Financial aid packet.
3. Send other required papers to the Coordinator;
4. Send your address, if it's different than the address on the scholarship application;
5. Notify Coordinator if college attendance plans change;
6. Inform Coordinator of all other financial aid or scholarships received for the year you choose to attend college classes.

## REQUIRED PAPERWORK

1. Complete scholarship application;
2. Final high school transcript (or copy of GED certificate);
3. Copy of your admission or acceptance into your selected college or university;
4. Financial Aid Form (FAF) analysis form College Scholarship Service (CSS) in California, AVCP code 4224;
5. Previous college grades.

If you completed an original scholarship application already, sending in a one-page reapplication form is okay.

For No. 4, above, the FAF analysis received by the AVCP Higher Education Program, MUST be for the appropriate academic year, for example, 1989-90; 1990-91, etc.
