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NOTICE OF UTILITY TARIFF FILING

The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby gives notice that TELEPHONE UTILITIES OF THE NORTHLAND, INC. (TUNI), has filed a tariff revision (TA2-358) affecting rules and charges in its tariff which is applicable in the areas served by the former Sitka Telephone Company.

TUNI states that the purpose of its filing is to delete reference to regulations and charges for customer premises work and inside wiring installation and maintenance. Most of the revisions involve these deletions. A summary of the proposed revisions is shown below.

In the "Description of Service," and "Construction, Maintenance and Use of Facilities" rules, TUNI proposes to remove all reference to utility owned or maintained jacks and inside wiring.

In Rate Schedule 1, "Exchange Service," TUNI proposes to remove from the tariff the reference to monthly rates per access line for inside wiring. The monthly inside wiring rates are \$5.00 for the St. Paul exchange and \$2.00 for all other exchanges except those which are designated as individual line service exchanges. There is presently no inside wire charge in individual line service exchanges. However, TUNI states that it plans to continue to charge customers for inside wiring as presently set forth in the tariff until its Account 232 is fully amortized by September 1991.

In Rate Schedule 2, "Non-recurring Service Charges," TUNI deletes the charges and conditions for moves, changes, premises work, and materials.

In Rate Schedule 17, "Key Telephone Service," TUNI deletes the provisions regarding the installation of inside wiring and move and changes of stations or equipment.

In Rate Schedule 23, "Customer Premises Equipment," TUNI deletes the rates and conditions for jack and plug installations.

TUNI states that customers now have the options of choosing the utility or some other organization or doing their own premise work and inside wire installation and maintenance. TUNI states that if the customer chooses to have the utility provide this function, it will apply current time and material charges on a declassified basis. TUNI also states that it plans to establish an optional monthly maintenance charge on a deregulated basis that extends its maintenance responsibility to include inside wire.

If after investigation the Commission finds a rate or classification different from that proposed by TUNI is reasonable, the Commission may approve a rate or classification which varies from that proposed.

Detailed information may be obtained from the utility whose address is 3940 Arctic Blvd., Anchorage, Alaska 99503. The filing may be inspected at the offices of the Alaska Public Utilities Commission, 420 "L" Street, Suite 100, Anchorage, Alaska 99501-1987.

Any interested person may file a statement of views favoring or opposing this tariff filing with the Alaska Public Utilities Commission. While comments will be considered by the Commission in determining the appropriate action to be taken, they will not serve to make the person a party to the proceeding. Any person wishing to become a party must file a petition to intervene in accordance with 3 AAC 48.110 of the Alaska Administrative Code.

To assure Commission consideration of comments or petitions prior to a final decision on this matter, they must be filed by February 8, 1987. Any comments filed with the Commission should clearly affirm that the interested person has filed a true copy of the statement with TUNI.
