The Personnel Rules have been redrafted, reorganized for publication and revised to better implement the purposes of a merit system of employment as set out at AS 39.-25.010. The rules conform to the requirements of AS 39.25.150, which requires that the rules provide for:

position classification plan; a pay plan; employee selection methods; eligible lists for appointment and promotion; filling vacancies by promotion; periods of probation; nonpermanent and emergency appointments; provisoinal appointments; transfers from one department to another and from another merit system jurisdiction to State service; transfers from one area of the State to another; granting employment preference to local residents under certain circum stances; reinstatement of persons who resign in good standing; layoffs; employee performance records; disciplinary measures; procedures for review of disputed personnel actions and resolving interagency and public grievances; hours of work; overtime work and pay; employment preference rights for veterans; part-time employ-ment; employment preference for severely handicapped persons; programs facilitating the employment of disadvantaged persons: delegation of appropriate personnel responsibilities and duties to principal executive departments; a transition period for employees moved from exempt or partially exempt to the classified service; other rules necessary for the enforcement of AS

39.25, the State Personnel Act. In addition to redrafting the rules for publication in regulation format, several substantive changes are proposed. Administrative changes are suggested to improved the efficiency of operation of the State system of personnel administration and to bring the rules into conformity with modern personnel practices.
