

Breakdown of BIA Federal Funds Given

The 1967 fiscal year federal program for Alaska includes \$47.5 million to Interior Department agencies. Of this amount, \$30.3 million has been allocated to the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

Following is the breakdown of these funds:

Education—\$8,810,920

Welfare and guidance services—\$1,803,040.

Relocation and adult vocational training—\$664,369.

Forest and range lands—\$47,100.

Agricultural and Industrial Assistance—\$686,860.

Maintenance of roads — \$40,000.

Development of Indian arts and crafts—\$93,517.

Management of Indian trust property—\$196,352.

Repair and maintenance of buildings and utilities—\$1,996,000.

Construction — \$13,598,000 (includes Akiachak School, \$914,000; Barrow gas line, \$490,000; Chalkyitsik School, \$278,000; Kodiak-Aleutian Vocational School, \$2,876,000; Kotzebue School addition, \$250,000; Newhalen School, \$253,000; Toksook Bay School, \$248,000; Mount Edgecumbe High School, \$7,369,000; major alterations and improvements, \$540,000; advance planning, \$300,000; water exploration and development, \$80,000).

Road construction (liquidation of contract authorization)—\$835,000 (Barrow, \$270,000; Juneau area office, \$50,000; Metlakatla, \$405,000; Tyonek, \$110,000).

Educational assistance grant —\$984,000.

Welfare and guidance services grants—\$261,000.
